

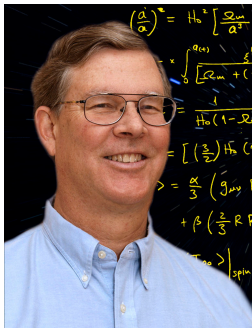
Hiscock Memorial Award 2012-2013

Congratulations to Bob Warwood, the recipient of the 2012-2013 Hiscock Memorial Award. Bob is a senior at Montana State University and recent addition to the Physics department. He is in his second year of affiliation with the MSGC as part of the Space Public Outreach Team (SPOT). As a presenter for SPOT, he has spent hundreds of hours giving NASA space talks to thousands of Montana K-12 students. A real Bozeman native, Bob is the recipient of the Hiscock Memorial Award for his proposal of a viral Public Service Announcement (PSA) series titled “Keep the Dream Alive,” which will highlight the importance of the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, with emphasis on the importance of space science and exploration. The purpose of such a project is an extension of the public outreach performed by the MSGC to motivate the public, and especially young people, to consider the STEM fields as viable career choices, or at least give support to the expansion of these fields- both philosophically and monetarily. Most importantly, such a project would serve to inspire- in order to combat the current trend of indifference and active anti-intellectualism toward sciences.
