All Montana undergraduates interested in STEM research experiences are invited to apply. We especially encourage applications from students who have not done research before and/or do not have an opportunity at their home campus. Workshops are nine hours of training plus a brief home project.

Participants receive a \$200 stipend. Travel to in-person workshops is reimbursed and meals are provided.

Each workshop can accommodate about 10 students.
